New Website Launch



Making Strides Toward Ministry Sustainability

mbatana Manor, an Empower Hope Business4Purpose™ project, is our first major endeavor into self-sustainability. The property for this ultra-luxe boutique hotel is nestled in the heart of Nairobi's most influential and prestigious Runda area, which is home to the capital's 93 diplomatic embassies.

In addition to helping to reduce dependence on charity to sustain the overhead of our ministries in Kenya, the Ambatana Manor project also aims to provide jobs for members of the community and improve the standard of living by helping to build much-needed infrastructure to the location—paving roads and providing access to clean water.

Construction first began January 2021 and continues steadily today, with the hotel's anticipated grand opening in 2024. "We are looking forward to the completion and success of the project," said Liz Ndegwa, Director of Operations for Ambatana Companies. "We would like to continue doing God's work by Kenyan people for Kenyan people."

VUKA Camp Graduate Leads Her Family Toward Healing—and Faith in Christ

he Empower Hope team at Mt. Elgon recently met with a local community member named Stephen and listened as he shared his story. He'd struggled for years with addiction to alcohol and had seen the negative effects it

was having on his family. He told us how his daughter Magdalene had come to a VUKA Rite of Passage Camp bearing the scars of his struggles. As she listened intently to the teaching and

shared her story, she began to find healing through faith in Christ. She is a very bright girl, had done well on her exams and qualified to go to a national high school in spite of the challenges at home.

Magdalene returned from camp, and it wasn't long before Stephen began to see positive changes in her behavior. He began to ask questions about her new-found faith, and she challenged him to stop drinking and also to go to the Empower Hope office for answers to his questions.

Elimu Msingi Scholarship Fund Meeting

28 Ambassadors were in attendance for the Group 5 meeting to receive information about college and the three pathways for their future.

- 1. Attend college/university

28 of our mentors at Mt. Elgon felt appreciated and renewed their commitment to continue serving.

VUKA Parents Engagement Forum

278 parents of VUKA Program members attended and were challenged to continue supporting their daughters.

Tembea Nami Fellowship

286 girls and boys attended; academic and spiritual performance was evaluated.

Global Leadership Training

12 staff & 4 Ambassadors gained improved leadership skills & knowledge

Ambassador Program (Nairobi)

- 45 young adults attended orientation for our Ambassador Training.
- 23 continuing students received college scholarships, and 10 students graduated from college.
- 25 new students were accepted into our college scholarship program and began classes in May.
- 8 newly-trained Ambassadors are interning in various places.

 Over 60 attended our recent All Ambassador HIV/AIDs Workshop training session.

Githogoro Empowerment Center (Nairobi)

Jan 27, 2023 - Land dedication

VUKA Camp (Mt. Elgon)

- 100 new girls/20 mentors attended, and all 100 girls attended the camp completion ceremony.
- 100 girls and 4 boys who completed our VUKA Program graduated from high school.
- 40 parents attended our VUKA Program Parents Engagement Forum.
- 65 young adults attended orientation and training to become VUKA Ambassadors, and 13 other attended the Mentor Orientation and Training.

Scholarship Program (Mt. Elgon)

- 110 girls were accepted into 9th grade (Form 1) in Jan 2023.
- 332 scholarship students have progressed to grades 10-12 (Forms 2-4).

 21 college scholarships were awarded to high school graduates.

Tailoring Class (Mt. Elgon)

- · 6 students graduated
- · 4 passed exams, 2 will retake
- 1 passed with honors
- 10 new students have begun classes

Culinary Class (Mt. Elgon)

7 students graduated, and all are engaged in cooking businesses within the communities.

Please continue to pray with us for the Mairori family as they work through the long grieving process and continue their work with Empower Hope Kenya.


